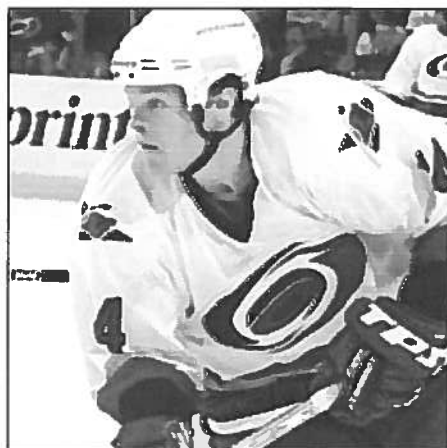
Kevyn Adams - a Key Role Player In Canes Success

The game is tied 1-1 with less than a minute to play in a crucial game for your team. Who do you put in the face-off circle? Canes Coach Paul Maurice has the luxury of calling on big names like Ron Francis, Rod Brind'amour, and Jeff O'Neill. However, Maurice just might bring in Kevyn Adams, an NHL veteran that has the skills and work ethic to make an impact on a team that went to the Stanley Cup Finals last year.

The Carolina Hurricanes acquired Kevyn Adams in January 2002 when the Canes dealt Byron Ritchie and Sandis Ozolinsh for Adams, Bret Hedican, and Tomas Malec. To say that he played a major role in the Canes playoff run would be an understatement.

"Kevin is a dynamite guy. He was part of the puzzle the Canes needed to put in place." Said Canes Television Play-By-Play Analyst John Forslund at a recent Storm Trackers luncheon.

When this team needs a forecheck, a big hit, a battle for the loose puck, Kevyn Adams always seems to be there to

provide a spark for the Canes. Adams was not always this type of role player. Early in his career, he was more of a skilled player. As a young man trying to make it in the NHL, he changed his game focusing more on the penalty kill and face-offs to raise his level of play to that of NHL-caliber. His hard work and dedication to the team game converted into a prolonged NHL career as a 4th line spark and

an invaluable role player to his team.

"Guys like this are as important as the front line guys to go far in the playoffs." Said Forslund.

Adams grew up in Buffalo, NY and graduated college with a degree from Miami of Ohio University, an accomplishment he was very proud to achieve.

"I stayed because my mother made me." Said Kevyn Adams.

He was drafted 25th overall by the Boston Bruins in the first round of the 1993 draft. Four years later, he signed with the Toronto Maple Leafs where he made his NHL debut.

After a successful playoff year with the Leafs in 2000, the Columbus Blue Jackets in the expansion draft acquired Adams. During the 2000-01 season, the Panthers traded Ray Whitney to acquire Adams. With the Florida Panthers organization in shambles and the hiring of Mike Keenan, Kevyn was eager to arrive in North Carolina after learning of the trade last season.

State of The Canes:

November's extended home stand was a good thing for the Carolina Hurricanes. With a record of 4-0-2-3, as of 11/21, Canes fans should be happy to see the reversal of fortunes for home games. I remember a time when our home record was worse than our away record. A big "Go Canes" to the crowds at the games lately. Weekday games may be less attended, but the noise level is just as high.

Defensively, we have been rock solid this past month. The Ward/Hill combo has certainly done their fair share of damage to opposing teams. They deliver hits that make those boards dance some nights. The Tanabe/Hedican pair, while small and less ferocious, are using their speed and great puck handling to get into the offensive zone. The penalty kill has been around 87%, about 6th in the NHL, nothing to sneeze at my friends.

Offensively, we need to settle on some line combos that are going to generate the electricity to light those goal lamps. Excuse me while I step into Bench Boss role here, but our defense can't keep winning one-goal games forever. Our power play percentage ranks 19th at 14.7% and is a big reason for the goal draught. I'm glad to see the return of the BBC Line. I really think that Brindy and Cole should be line mates for life. The Adams Family line continues to explode with a tenacity that should be emulated by the first and fourth lines. They could really use an explosive left-winger on their line. Hmmm, we've

got one named Hlavac so let's experiment there, but then we need to settle down, really.... The face off continues to be one of our greatest strengths. Ranked 1st in the NHL, at 56.9% with Brind'Amour, Francis and K. Adams centering the top three lines and Brindy ranking 2nd in total face off wins with 291 out of 479 as of 11/21.

- Big yoohoos for Cole and Tanabe for reaching 100 and 200 games each respectively. Was it just yesterday when we all thought Cole should be up for consideration for a Calder Trophy.

We all know and appreciate the magnitude of this "small feat". His excellent conditioning and Samson-like strength along with his jump and ferocity at the boards are all testaments to what a great player we have in Rod. Our alternate captain's face off, penalty killing and power play opportunities are exceptional. Rod becomes the 3rd player to reach 1,000 games with this franchise behind Brian Propp (3/2/94) and our own Glen Wesley (1/20/01).
- Honestly, fans can boo Primeau every time he skates in our building: not me, I'll be the one in *The Cheap Seats* clapping and

thankng him for delivering us one fine example of how to be a Prim-eau player and role model

- Captain Ron Francis reached another significant milestone. He tied Pat Verbeek for 23rd on the NHL's all-time goals scored list in the Canes 7-3 win over the Canadiens on November 23rd.

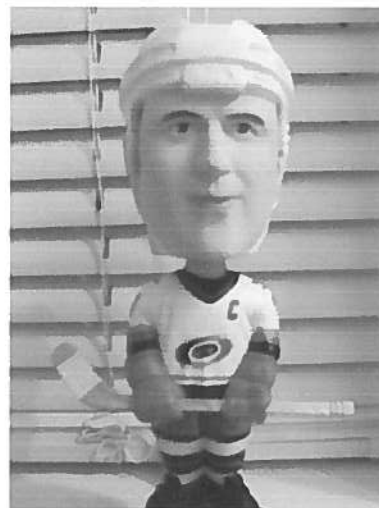

Adams has appreciated his time in the league no matter what team or what role he plays.

"It's the best job in the world and I'm lucky to be here." Said Adams.

Adams has become a face-off specialist for the Canes when they were struggling early this season. Before the 8-second face-off rule, Kevyn used to be one of the guys that ensured everyone was in position before taking the draw. With the new rules, everyone is now on their own. In order to remain effective in the face-off circle, Adams has to try different things and do his homework before facing each opponent.

"Know who you're taking the draw against." Advised Kevyn Adams. "I know who they are and how they are setting up."

Last season, Adams scored a playoff goal against Jose Thodore in Game 6 of the Montreal series. This season, Adams has stepped up to the third line while Josef Vasicek recovers from back spasms. The stellar performances by Adams have bought Vasicek time without the pressure of a premature return. When the Canes needed the boost, Adams has been there. It has never come easy for Kevyn Adams.

"Every team uses their fourth line differently." Commented Adams. "People don't realize how tough it is when looking at the stat sheet."

The fourth line players often do not get the attention and gratification they deserve especially when looking at the score sheet. These players may only play 2-4 minutes per game on most occasions.

"It's a tough, tough job, but it is a very important job." Said Adams.

When his career is done, no one may remember how many goals and assists Adams has, but they will remember what kind of guy he was and how important he was to a Carolina Hurricanes team that reached a pinnacle in franchise history. Adams already has a special place in Hurricanes history.

Canes Fan Visits Martin Gelinias in Atlanta / Bill Horner

I found myself, on Opening Night, thinking there was a possibility – maybe just a chance – that he'd still be in the lineup.

So I held my breath in the moment between the pre-game introductions of Sean Hill (the Hurricanes' #22) and Sami Kapanen (#24) back in October, straining in the darkness and looking for the familiar #23 of Martin Gelinias to emerge from the team's locker room.

No such luck.

Instead of taking the ice at the newly-christened RBC Center, Gelinias was in another world – the NHL's Western Conference – preparing for his debut with the Calgary Flames, his new team.

When your favorite player gets dealt, or pursues free agency, as Gelinias did, it requires an adjustment period. After getting to know Marty over the last three seasons and charting his failures (few) and successes (many) with the Canes, I was looking at a very long adjustment as Carolina began defense of its Eastern Conference crown – captured, of course, on Gelinias' overtime goal in Toronto. Calgary shows up on ESPN even less frequently than the Hurricanes, and as the schedule would have it, the Flames don't even play in Raleigh this year. And the one trip the Hurricanes make to Calgary (Dec. 12) coincides with an out-of-town business trip I have planned – to Kentucky, no less, not the province of Alberta.

So when the phone in my office rang on a late Friday afternoon in October, and Martin Gelinias was on the other end, it was more than a very pleasant surprise – it was the beginning of a series of events that would see my wife Lee Ann and me plan and execute a trip to Atlanta soon thereafter to see Gelinias and his new teammates take on the Thrashers.

I'd had some contact with Marty during the off-season, mostly through e-mail. I got one message from him while he and his family (wife Jane and kids Matty and Morgan) were vacationing in Hawaii, and another the day before his free-agency signing with the Flames was announced. He wrote, "We may be moving to – Calgary?" After the move, we talked once about the possibility of my family and some friends (season-ticket-holder Kenny Avery, also a big Gelinias fan, and his family) making the long journey to Calgary, a trip that wouldn't materialize for us because my schedule got in the way.

But after getting his call and figuring out that the Flames would be as close as Atlanta within just two weeks, a trip south made sense.

We flew down on Sunday, Nov. 10, the day after the next-to-last leg of a long road trip for Calgary. The Flames had the day off after playing in Florida the night before, and we met Marty in the lobby of Atlanta's Ritz-Carlton at 6:30 p.m. We spent the next two hours catching up during a very nice dinner at Mumbo Jumbo, a restaurant two blocks from the hotel. I can't express in words how enjoyable it was to spend that time with him. If you've ever had the chance to talk with Martin Gelinias (and many fans have, given his natural kindness and generosity with his time) you know how great it can be. In fact, he told us at the end of our evening together he enjoyed catching up with friends and fans because he liked the privilege of sharing his NHL experiences with others. And when four other Hurricanes/Gelinias fans were waiting for him when we returned to the hotel (none for Jarome Iginla or Chris Drury) you know he means it.

So how is he doing in Calgary? With 13 points in 12 games going into the match-up with Atlanta, Martin Gelinias was doing pretty good. And although the Flames lost the Veterans Day matinee to the Thrashers we saw the next day – and would eventually go on something of an extended losing streak – it's fair to say Gelinias is happy in western Canada.

The Flames (which gave him a three-year contract) were one of several teams interested in Gelinias when the free-agency period began last July 1. Montreal, Toronto and the New York Rangers were among the teams vying for his services, he told us, but given that Marty's off-season stomping grounds are near Vancouver, and that his wife has family in Calgary, the move made sense.

We talked a lot about the transition to Calgary, his new teammates there, the Hurricanes' run to the Finals, what all our kids were up to, etc. We felt fortunate to have had the chance to visit with him because he was expecting other fans/friends from North Carolina to visit Atlanta for the game, not to mention the surprise guests waiting at the hotel after dinner.

Lee Ann and I sat behind Calgary's bench the next day and got to see the action up close, but we were among the very few of the small crowd of 10,501 (Atlanta's smallest ever for hockey, not surprising given the 3 p.m. start time) not happy with the results of the game, a 2-1 Thrashers win.

We arranged to visit with Marty after the game, and he was in good spirits despite the loss. We took pictures and said good-byes and promised to make a visit to Calgary when time and circumstances permitted.
